**BOOK REVIEWS**

Every executive seeking Christian solutions to workplace issues should have Dr. Senske's and Mr. Hill's books in his library. Book reviews of these two books were delivered in prior breakfast meetings of the Society of Apostolic Executives. The following are brief excerpts from those reviews and the books.

"Executive Values" provides practical everyday advice on implementing faith in effective leadership. It demonstrates how Christian values provide a basis for attracting and retaining employees, creating a Christ-based effective organizational structure, implementing a successful vision and strategic plan, and successfully balancing career and family life.

"Just Business" uses case studies and their solutions to demonstrate how to apply Christian ethics in the marketplace. His case studies deal with employer-employee relations, honesty and deception, employee rights, discrimination and affirmative action, and the environment.
